Fire-fighting equipment & Alarm breaks

Upper Church Hall:	Red Foam fire extinguisher near RHS entrance Red Foam fire extinguisher at bottom of RHS stairs (by disabled toilet) Red Water fire extinguisher at bottom of LHS stairs (by Youth Mix cupboard) <i>Alarm breaks at top & bottom of stairs (on both sides)</i>
Lower Church Hall:	Red Water fire extinguisher near fire exit door Alarm break by fire exit door Alarm break in chair storage cupboard
Kitchen:	Fire blanket on RHS of open shelving (near main hatch) Red CO2 (electrical) fire extinguisher (by post rack) <i>in entrance area</i>
Entrance Area:	Red CO2 (electrical) fire extinguisher (by post rack) for kitchen use Red Foam fire extinguisher <i>Alarm breaks x 2 @ notice boards / by men's toilets</i>
Richard Johnson (RJ) Room:	Red Water fire extinguisher @ exit door to cellar / fire exit Alarm break by exit door to cellar / fire exit
Balcony:	Red Water fire extinguisher x 2 (one each side) Red Water fire extinguisher outside church office / bottom of stairs
Sanctuary:	Red Foam fire extinguisher @ band area Red CO2 (electrical) fire extinguisher @ organ Red CO2 (electrical) fire extinguisher @ AV desk Red Water fire extinguisher in back corridor near light switches / fire exit <i>Alarm break in back corridor near light switches / fire exit</i>

Sanctuary:	Off back corridor behind sanctuary (push bar)
